Jail Population Review:

55 inmates; 4 boarded in Bayfield County, 12 inmates on Electronic Monitoring

TAD report:

14 participants, 4 absconder, 1 person in jail for violations.

Probation/Parole

Adult Drug court report:

14 active participants; three others are serving jail sentences; two more are approved to start ADC; three individuals are in the assessment phase. The grant has been renewed for the next year.

Longrun report:

8 individuals completed 82 hours of community service

Children of Incarcerated Parents:

The committee is pursuing applying for a grant to provide a Child Advisory Center to the region. There are no CAC's north of Highway 8. There is a critical need for a CAC in our Bay area. Children who are victims, directly or indirectly, need to feel safe while being interviewed. Children are often interviewed at the jail (only facility available with necessary equipment) and are intimidated by the facility and affect the interviews and the interviewers' ability to gather information from the child.

CCR (Coordinated Community Response)

There will be a DV newsletter coming out next month entitled "Justice by the Bay". Content will include best practices across the state by law enforcement. The lethality assessment has been implemented in the City. There are 11 questions to the assessment. The victim is asked the questions to determine danger. The assessment can be attached to the probable cause statement and used by the Judge for bail assessments.

Data has shown that when these assessments are used that victims get services quicker and the homicide rates have gone down.

There was also discussion about the Blueprint for Safety Model. This is a comprehensive framework for responding to domestic violence calls.

New Business:

State vs Loomis - COMPAS evaluations are Ok'd for use

Attorneys may get educational credits for doing Pro Bono work.

Ashland County DNA proof of submission form- if an individual is booked on one of the DNA listed statutes then the DNA is collected at the jail.

Survey results- this was a small sample but it still reflected that suitable housing for individuals coming out of jail or prison was the number one concern.
