### **Jail Population Review:**

The population was down 20-30 people and then jumped up to 50 inmates over the weekend. There are 6 inmates housed in the Bayfield county jail.

### **TADPRO report:**

Six people on TAD, two are partnered with Drug Court

### **Probation/Parole**

There are four new agents graduating agent basic training next week. Unit 601 has 513 supervised cases; 21 are in jail on holds; 10 are in revocation status. Nine people were locked up on holds over the weekend.

### **Adult Drug court report:**

23 active cases; Six participants are in phase 4.

### **Ashland Recycling report:**

62 community service hours performed over the last month. Working with Community Corrections Employment program to establish a job site.
